Adhering to the rustic-lux island aesthetic, Eliamos comprises 12 whitewashed cubist villas decked out in natural stone, wood and rattan, each with a dining terrace, pool and one, two or three bedrooms.

There is a spa, a gym, a restaurant serving local organic cuisine, and pursuits including kayaking, SUP, yoga and pilates.
