Flung open its doors in Paris (where else?), in the 17th arrondissement, Maison ELLE is the first from the collection. Bijoux in spirit and size, it has just 25 beautifully curated rooms and suites as well as a spa. At the heart of the hotel is a celebration of design, craftsmanship and female

Meanwhile, over in Le Marais, Paris's beloved boho quarter, new opening, **Le Grand Mazarin**, aims to be an ode to all things Parisian. The property is the latest from Maisons Pariente, which presides over the renowned Crillon Le Brave, Lou Pinet and Le Coucou properties.

Swedish designer Martin Brudnizki, who created the eclectic interiors, says he was inspired by Le Marais's reputation for hedonism, multi-culturalism and creativity

and has based the designs on the area's grand, aristocratic houses of old.

Across the 61 rooms and suites, a rich colour palette is blended with whimsical touches and nods to French classicism are uplifted with modern-day amenities, such as an 'experiential' bar and swimming pool. It's the perfect place to make a splash.
